It's All About **Confidence and Connections**

This fall Intercambio is launching its new English curriculum, *Confidence and Connections*.

Executive Director, Lee Shainis, established a vision for the new curriculum to "spark conversations that enable students and teachers to share experiences and perspectives." In this spirit, Confidence and Connections is seamlessly aligned with Intercambio's strategic mission to "ignite human potential by cultivating a world where people from different backgrounds connect, communicate and engage."

Many important features have been added to the new series. Every lesson includes pronunciation activities and a two-way learning "Culture Tip," opening the door for discussion and cultural exchange. As students and teachers get to know each other, cultural understanding, friendships, and trust are cemented. A "Connect with

Conversation" section at the end of each lesson facilitates students' review of the words, phrases and structures from the lesson, as well as previous lessons.

The new curriculum includes a measurable progress check every seven lessons as a way to measure students' English language acquisition. In addition, a new evaluation tool is being developed to gauge how learning English, gaining confidence and making connections is having a ripple effect on students' personal and professional lives, as well as their children and the greater community.

The Confidence and Connections teacher books were developed with a single goal in mind: teaching made easy. With the student book embedded into the teacher book it will be even easier for volunteer teachers to prepare for class. The goals for each lesson are clearly spelled out. Within each lesson, there are short "callouts" that provide succinct notes about how to teach the activities. In the back of the teacher book, there are bonus training pages for teachers who want to learn more about how to

Trained as an industrial engineer,
Daniella moved from Venezuela
to Colorado three years ago to
create a better life for her family.
With limited English language
skills and a lack of U.S. work
experience, Daniella describes
her search for a career in her field as
"difficult, if not impossible" when she
arrived.

After hearing about Intercambio from a friend, Daniella decided to try a class with Intercambio. Her goal was to improve her English and get a job in her field, and after one class she was in love with the program. Daniella began as a Level 4 student and quickly committed herself to studying hard and completed Level 7 in less than three years.

Daniella remembers one particularly important connection made through Intercambio at a *Conversation Team* activity.

Each term, one-time volunteers join with students in small groups for dialog and English practice. This *Conversation Team* replaces regular lessons for one

class per term. Volunteers learn more about the immigrant experience, and everyone has the opportunity to connect, communicate and engage with someone outside their day-to-day community.

Daniella recently, at Conversation Team, met a person who worked at an engineering company. Within a few months, Daniella was hired by his company, and back working in her profession. Daniella says, "Intercambio can open opportunities!"


inspiring to see. Watching students gain self-confidence.
