

# INDIRECT QUESTIONS WITH HE OR SHE

We often use indirect questions in English to sound more polite.  
Change each direct question below to an indirect question.

1. **Direct Question:** Where does she live?

# NOTES FOR THE TEACHER

**Indirect questions** can be used to ask questions in a more polite way.
